FOR A MORE FRUITFUL LENT

Every year our Catholic faith gives us 40 days to imitate Jesus' time of prayer and fasting in the desert (Luke 4:1-2). This is a perfect time to try a new form of sacrifice or to enrich your prayer life Fast on Fridays: The Church requires us to fast only two days each year—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—but we can certainly undertake this penitential sacrifice more frequently during lent. Pray the Stations of the Cross: Most parishes pray the Stations on Fridays or Wednesdays during Lent as a group. If you are unable to attend, find some quiet time during the week to visit your church and prayerfully follow Jesus in these 14 events of His Passion and Crucifixion. Commit to a Weekly Holy Hour: Spending an hour in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament is so pleasing to our Savior. "So you could not ● keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test." (Matthew 26:40-41) Practice Charity: Go through your closets and pantry to find clothes, toys, food and other items to donate to the poor. You might also volunteer your time to a charity or visit the sick in a hospital or nursing home. Perhaps you can give up some luxury or habit during Lent and make • a donation with the money you saved. Read the Gospels: Ask the Holy Spirit to help you know, understand and live the Word of God as you prayerfully read through the gospels. Spend extra time in prayer and meditation as you read the four different accounts of Jesus' Passion and death. Discover a New Saint: The saints are our heroes and heroines in faith. They are ordinary people who practiced extraordinary virtue and cano inspire us to do the same. During Lent, find a saint who interests you and learn more about his or her life. Ask the saint to pray for you.
