

ALMSGIVING DURING LENT

We know God blesses those who come to the aid of the poor and rebukes those who turn away from them: "Give to him who begs from you, do not refuse him who would borrow from you" (Mt 5:42). Almsgiving in this sense is one of the most important things we can do to remake the world and restore it. It has to do with time, with money and goods. What are alms today? It isn't limited to just money, though money can be important, because money and all it gives us, can so easily become the focus of our 'worship'. "You cannot serve God and Mammon" (Luke 16:13). So almsgiving is not only something we do to benefit the poor, but to 'benefit' us, assisting our 'conversion of heart', and our growing in freedom. Almsgiving can also involve giving generously of our time, and many other things. Almsgiving is among what are known as the 'corporal works of mercy': consisting especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity: it is also a work of justice pleasing to God (Mt 6:2-4). These 'works of mercy' are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities. The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God."(Catechism of the Catholic Church, no.2462). Fr.
