RESURRECTED JESUS MEETS THE DISIPLES ON THE ROAD TO EMMAUS

Two followers of Jesus left Jerusalem and were on their way home to their town of Emmaus. They were totally disappointed and discouraged with what happened to Jesus of Nazareth. They pinned their hopes on him, but he let them down. Jesus was a total failure. Jesus was dead. They never thought about the resurrection. They never believed the promise of Jesus that he will rise again on the third day. That is why even when Jesus joined them on the road, and talked to them, they did not recognize him. It was only when he broke bread with them that their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. There are three truths that emerge from this Gospel story. First, Jesus is the Eternal Word made flesh. He is the Word of God. Therefore, he alone has the right and the absolute power to interpret the Scriptures. He did this on the road to Emmaus. And the resurrection of Jesus explains the whole Scriptures. Second, the disciples recognized Jesus only when he broke bread with them. He first did this at the Last Supper, when he instituted the sacrament of the Eucharist. In other words, the Eucharist is the real presence of Jesus. We ought to recognize him and experience his unmistakable presence in every celebration of the Eucharist. Third, after recognizing Jesus in the Scriptures and in the Eucharist, the disciples went back to Jerusalem to announce and share the good news of his resurrection. Every time we come to Mass, the Scriptures are proclaimed to us, and then we receive the body and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. But our Christian life does not stop there. We have to announce the good news of the resurrection of Jesus through our lives. The faith we have received has to be shared to other people so that one day will come when the entire world will kneel down and worship Jesus as our Lord and God. Amen
